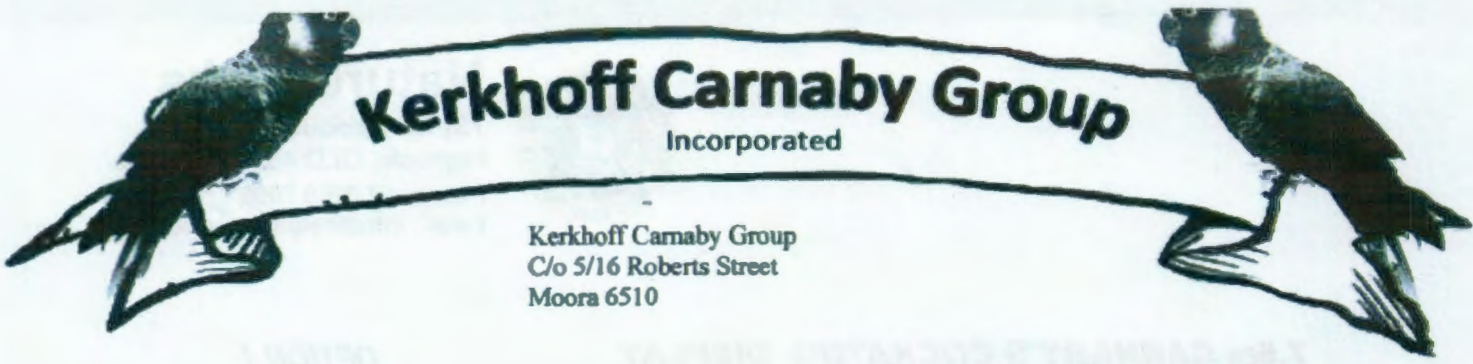

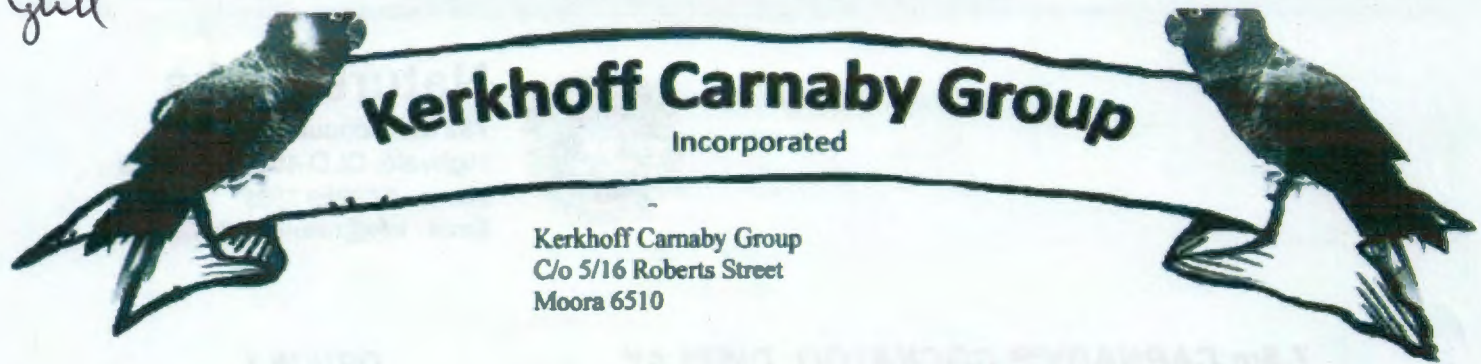

The Moora Community Resource Centre also runs the Visitor Information Centre for the Shire of Moora and we believe this project will provide benefit to many facets of the wider community, including tourism, business and increased community awareness.

We are happy to provide the raw data for Moora over the past 7-8 years to support this application. If successful, our staff are happy to promote the feature to visitors as we do currently for the Town Clock, businesses, points of interest & other attractions.

We currently employ an extra person approx. 3 days a week for a maximum of 3 months of the year, casually, during our busy wildflower season approx. Aug to Oct each year. We operate out of the old Railway Building that also houses the Community Resource Centre.

Given the proposed increase in tourism numbers, a new / dedicated Tourist and Visitor Information Centre would be required, adequately funded and staffed with access to public toilets. This new building / business / venture we would expect to create an extra 1.5 to 3 FTE positions, with the potential on taking on a trainee to study tourism.
